Do you surrender?

Thames Valley Police has been appealing to the public to hand in any unwanted, unlicensed or illegal firearms and ammunition, staged as a special Surrender Fortnight in May. However, it's not too late, and it's still possible to surrender firearms anonymously and without prosecution. Many firearms are held in ignorance of their illegality, others are simply no longer required. Guns and ammunition can be surrendered at designated police stations, including Banbury and Oxford.

North Aston Village Meeting

Thursday 3rd May 2021 ~ The Minutes

Officers present: Chair Lucinda Fuoco (LF), Treasurer Sue Hatzigeorgiou (SH). Those present: Dave Hanna (DH), Annabel Bevan (AB), Niel Nicholson (NN), Liz Nicholson (LN), Mark Stay (MS), Ginny Stay (GS), Nick Miller (NM), James Taylor (JT), Chloe Woodhead (CW), Christopher Woodhead (ChW), Kildare Bourke-Burrows (KBB), Trudy Busby (TB), Clive Busby (CB), Jeremy Taylor (JmT), Mary Healy (MH), Julie Al-Nugaidi (JA). Apologies for Absence: Secretary Annie Savage (AS), Marcus Potts (MP).

Village Meeting

1. Welcome and Structure of Meeting

LF welcomed everyone to the meeting. She explained that as Annie was unable to attend, she proposed that SH should take the Minutes, and this was approved.

2. Minutes of Last Meeting

The Minutes of the last meeting, held on 7th January 2022, had been published in the *North Aston News* and copies were available in the meeting. GS proposed that the minutes should be approved; this was seconded by CW. This was agreed by the Meeting. The Minutes were therefore signed as a correct record.

3. Annual Governance Accountability Return

and Accounts 2021/22

The following papers were tabled:

- Annual Governance Statement 2021/22
- Accounting Statements for 2021/22
- Certificate of Exemption AGAR 2021/22 Form 2PM
- Annual Internal Audit Report 2021/22

SH reported that income of £300 had been received; expenditure had been £235 and an internal audit of the accounts had been carried out. She explained that as expenditure had been less that £25,000 the Meeting could certify itself as exempt from having to submit an *Annual Governance and Accountability Return* to the external auditor.

NN proposed that the *Certificate of Exemption*, the *Accounting Statements and Annual Governance Statement* should be approved; this was seconded by ChW. These were all then approved.

4. Insurance and Risk Register

SH reported that the insurance would need to be renewed in June and that AS had said that she would look into this as a new insurer was required. She reported that the officers had reviewed the Risk Register during the year as part of the Annual Governance Review procedures.

5. Election of Officers

LF reminded the meeting that she, AS and SH were all standing down so new officers were required as follows:

- Chair. LN nominated ChW; this was seconded by CW. ChW confirmed that he was happy to stand. There were no other nominations and ChW was duly elected.
- Secretary. NN reported that Eve Rodgers (ER) had said that she would be happy to stand as Secretary and nominated her for the post. This was seconded by GS. There were no other nominations and ER was duly elected.
- Treasurer. CW proposed NN; this was seconded by JT. NN confirmed that he was happy to stand. There were no further nominations and NN was duly elected.

LF thanked all the new Officers for agreeing to take on these roles and the outgoing Officers were thanked for all they had done during their terms of office.

There being no further business the Village Meeting closed.

Village Forum

1. Traffic Committee update

KBB said that he was happy to take the lead on the Traffic Committee. This was agreed. It was noted that other members were CB, LF, MP, Les Parry and Bev Merry. It was agreed that the

Committee would provide an update to the next Meeting.

2. Speed Monitor

CB reported that there were still ongoing problems with the speed monitor. He was liaising with the German company to try and resolve this. It was noted that the technology had moved on since the original speed monitor had been bought but that a new monitor would be £3.5k. CB was thanked for all his work on this.

3. SRFI Consultation

It was agreed that it would be up to the new committee to take forward discussions on the Strategic Rail Freight Interchange. In the meantime it was noted that all households had received the consultation on this and therefore each household could comment individually.

4. Jubilee Celebrations & Village Fête

Celebrations to mark the Queen's Jubilee were discussed and it was agreed that a Big Lunch would be held on the Green on Friday 2nd June, to start at 12.30pm. This would be a "bring and share" event, with a welcome drink. Tables would be set up on the road across the Green. AB agreed to co-ordinate this (with help!). In case the weather was not good enough for an outdoor event, LN said that the Orchard Barn at Nicholsons could be used instead. A budget of up to £250 was approved for expenses. The possibility of holding a Fête was also discussed but it was felt that it was now a bit late to organise this. Instead, maybe some of the village games could be available at the Jubilee Celebrations and possibly Aunt Sally.

It anticipated that the Flower & Produce Show would be held as usual at the end of the Summer.

It was noted that the Church had usually been a recipient of half the profits from the village fête and concern was expressed about whether the Church would be relying on this this year. CB confirmed that the Church did need money and that it needed to demonstrate community support, but there were other sources of funding available in the short term. It was agreed therefore that there would be collection boxes available at the Jubilee Celebrations for anyone who wished to make a donation to the church.

It was hoped that information about the proposed Jubilee Celebrations could be included in the hard copy of the next newsletter and that MP should be asked to circulate this by email. The possibility of planting a tree for the Jubilee on the Green was also discussed and agreed that this should be done in November.

5. Pre-Loved Sale

JA thanked everyone for help and support with the Pre-Loved sale, which had raised £510. It was agreed that this had been a great event and JA was thanked for having organising it.

6. BoB Group

It was noted that this was a really good way of providing "light touch" engagement within the community. It was agreed that the minutes would be published in the *North Aston News*.

7. Dog Bins

As requested, Annie had researched the cost of dog bins as follows: 25 litre bin, wall mounted: £120; 50 litre bin £316 to £450 depending on fixings; £130 per annum weekly emptying

It was agreed not to pursue any of these options and that dog owners should be encouraged to "stick and flick" rather than use poo bags.

8. Mikron Theatre

This has been booked for Friday 24th June

9. Aunt Sally

This would be resuming on 11th May on the Village Green.

10. Fountain Water Tap

CB has reported that there were ongoing problems with the tap on the fountain and that there was a crack in the water trough. He would keep an eye on this and report to the meeting if necessary.

11. Tug of War

MS reported that Duns Tew had been in touch to ask if North Aston would take part in the Tug-of-War at their village fête on 3rd July. This was agreed. It was suggested that a "return match" could be held during the Flower & Produce Show.

12. Village Defibrillator

MS said that new pads were needed for the village defibrillator as the existing ones were now out of date. This was approved and MS agreed to source these. LN added that there was also a defibrillator at Nicholsons.

13. Welcome Pack for Newcomers to the Village

KBB suggested that it would be nice to have a Welcome Pack which could be given to new arrivals to the village. This was agreed and KBB agreed to put this together.

14. Thank you

LF thanked CB and Hal Busby for all their work in mowing the Green; MP for producing the newsletter and NN and LN for all that they and Nicholsons do for the Village.

SH reported that, because there had not been a Village Meeting before Christmas, the usual donations of £250 to MP and CB had not been paid last year. She therefore proposed that these should be paid retrospectively for the year ended, and also for the current year. After discussion, CW proposed that this should be increased to £300 for the current year. This was seconded by NN and agreed.

There being no further business the meeting closed.

Deddington crew attended and ran a raffle and awareness stall at a local vintage tractor ploughing match and put on a carwash event supported by Deputy Chief Fire Officer Bowcock, Group Manager Swadling and Area Manager Adcock. The **URCH MATTERS**

All good things ...

So it's time for me to say farewell. I am enormously grateful to have been Rector here for the past

nine years - it has been a genuine joy. It has been wonderful to be able to write occasional words of hope and to pass on information of things that have been going on in church life via these pages, and as I look back - I do think there has been quite a bit of hope and quite a lot of stuff going on!

Quite apart from all the weddings and christenings we have celebrated together, as well as those we have loved and trusted into God's tender keeping, we've had a new organ in North Aston and windows renovated; a new pathway to the church and cottages built in the village at Tackley (thanks to Bob Clow, whose gift has made the



church more financially secure than for a very long time); we've celebrated all kinds of community events and concerts in Steeple Aston, had a new bell in the tower, and although we haven't seen out plans for the church project come to fruition, we've done an enormous amount of fantastic work that is ready to be taken forward at the right time.

It's invidious to pull out specific events, but perhaps I may be allowed to comment on the most recent, our Concert for Ukraine? To me it spoke of the best that we offer as the church in our benefice - providing a focal gathering place for a whole community, doing something very concrete to help people in need. So far the musicians, singers, schoolchildren, readers and all under Nick Cleobury's phenomenal guidance have raised over £6,000 for UNICEF and the British Red Cross appeals. Thank you to everyone!

I've had a couple of visitors recently who have spent time in our

church buildings, and who have commented on the care that is so obviously taken over these places. They haven't begun to see the half of it. People who put flowers out, or who take time to polish brass, or who mow the grass, or who tend graves of loved ones, or who provide music, or ring bells, or sort hymn books, or who provide things for children to do, or who unlock the doors, or who dust and clean, or who come in to pray, or who take time with

occasional visitors, or who help when school classes visit, or who are simply ready to do whatever needs doing. Our churches are communities. And it has been my joy to be a part of these communities for nearly a decade.

But now:

June begins with the Jubilee weekend, and our services on June 5th will mark this wonderful event. North Aston has a traditional prayer book communion at 9.30am, Tackley is at 11am for a village Celebration Service, and Steeple at 6pm for a Coronation Songs of Praise with a choir and lots of music to join in. Come to any or all! And June 12th at 11am sees my final service - a United Service for the whole Benefice held at Steeple Aston. Everyone from all our villages is welcome. Please join us - I'd love to see you there as I take my leave as Rector.

And then?


