Another relatively quiet month, with just two new applications, one already approved. The second involves the ongoing restoration work being carried out to The Hall. North Aston Hall, St Mary's Walk, OX25 6AA. An application has been submitted to carry out various internal alterations throughout all floors and levels of The Hall, from basement to the second floor. Comments deadline is 29th Sept, with a target decision date of 10th Oct. Reference Nos: 22 / 02475 / LB

The Turret House, St Mary's Walk, OX25 6AA. An application has been approved to carry out work on trees within a conservation area. This will involve lifting the entire crown of a whitebeam (*Sorbus aria*) and pruning the north side to create clearance from the garage. Reference Nos: 22 / 02191 / TCA

North Aston Nature Notes With Stephen Rees

A departure from the usual Nature Notes this month. The enduring dry weather has been great for walking, but has left me with little to say about our local wildlife, so I thought I'd write about one of my favourite things; the Oxford Canal.

I have loved the canal all my life. Our dad was the Water Bailiff at Somerton and my brothers and I were strictly forbidden from the river until we were 16, so all our fishing before then was restricted to the canal. I loved it, and I still do now.

Me and Dave, my middle brother, would walk down to the canal, fish all day in the summer hols, and dad would see us on his way home from work, stop, and give us a lift home.

For us, the fishing was good. Old second-hand peacock quill floats were the order of the day, and our main target was Gudgeon. If we got lucky we might catch a few Roach or Perch, but we'd sit all day to catch 'em ... and have a sneaky fag or two as well.

As we grew older the canal changed. They added some small carp, and that changed everything. They grew really quickly and soon the Oxford became a venue for carp fishers from all over the country.

We made a method of our own to catch them. We would fish through the night with a top from a Fairy Liquid bottle fixed to the line, and a candle in a jar under it. If it shot up, we had a fish on the hook. The bait we used was sweetcorn, stolen from Mum's cupboard.



A few years later they held the national championship on the Oxford. We would be fishing down there and all our heroes out of the Angling Times would come walking along, asking us how deep it was, what bait we used, and what we had caught. I even met my hero Ivan Marks one day.

Me and dad spent the day down there when the held the National, walking along, watching one thousand five hundred men fishing. Those days are long gone now, and the canal today is very poor fishing, with few fish, loads of boats, and very sorry water ... but maybe it just seems better in my memorv. Regards, Steve & Wendy

This powerful concert will celebrate Ukraine's rich cultural heritage in Oxford's Sheldonian Theatre. The Orchestra will be teaming up with musicians from the New Era Orchestra of Kyiv to culminate Oxford's first **Ukrainian Culture Weeks Festival** with a performance of works by Ukrainian composers, including Silvestrov's poignant *Prayer for Ukraine* and Mykola Lysenko's *Motet* alongside Handel's inimitable *Messiah*.

The concert will raise vital funds for grassroots humanitarian work in those areas most affected by the Russian invasion.

Ticket prices vary from £10 (upper gallery) through to £40 for prime seats, with Ukrainian nationals welcomed for free.


