Mark Hichens

18 January 1925 - 26 November 2022

Mark Hichens, who died very peacefully at the end of November aged 96, was one of the last connections with his family's 54 year ownership of North Aston Hall, and was well known to many in the village.

In later years he very often came to stay with his sister Phoebe in Folly Field House, and spent years clearing and restoring the Squire's Walk and The Folly.

He came with his family to the village as a young child in 1929, grew up here, and went on to teach history for all of his active life. History was his passion, and he wrote many books on historical topics, both erudite and amusing, the last of them very recently.

He also wrote *Lady Flora had a Farm*, a thinly veiled fictional account of their life in the village, which many of us were able to chuckle at. He continued to be very interested in North Aston life and always seemed to know what was going on, even before some of us did. He wrote a good account of wartime life in the village in *North Aston ~ A Millennium*.

Mark was a wonderful man, and will be very sadly missed by all his friends. It's hoped that there will be a Memorial service for him in St Mary's in January, when a fuller account of his life will be published in the *News*. *KB-B*

Books by Mark Hichens include Abdication: The Rise and Fall of Edward VIII, Wives of the Kings of England and The Inimitable P.G. Wodehouse: The Story of His Life and a Treasury of His Wit. His most recent, Capitalism Versus Communism: The Cold War, was published in 2020.

Keeping the Home Fires Burning

With more of us resorting to open fires and log-burners as the price of other forms of domestic heating continues to rise, Kildare was intrigued to find a hand-written poem amongst some old papers. He took a photo, but here's a transcript.

Log Fires


Beech wood fires are bright and clear, if the logs are kept a year. Chestnut's only good, they say, if for long it's laid away. But Ash wood new, or Ash wood old, is fit for Queen with Crown of Gold.

Birch and Fir logs burn too fast, blaze up bright and do not last. It is, by the Irish said, that Hawthorn bakes the sweetest bread. Elm wood burns like churchyard mould, e'en the flames are very cold; But Ash wood green, or Ash wood brown, is fit for Queen with Golden Crown.

Poplar has a bitter smoke, fills your eyes and makes you choke. Apple wood will scent your room with an incense like perfume. Oaken logs, if dry and old, keep away the Winter's cold, But Ash wood wet, or Ash wood dry, a King shall warm his slippers by!

Cooling the Coals

On a related note, the sale of traditional, domestic "House Coal" will become illegal from 1st May next year. That's the small nuggets of natural coal that tend to produce large amounts of smoke. Bagged House Coal has already been unavailable since May 2021. Instead, coal merchants and retailers will be asked to supply specialist coals for domestic fires and solid-fuel boilers, such as anthracite and low-volatile steam coal. Anthracite-based "Smokeless Ovals", such as Phurnacite, are another cost-effective, multi-purpose fuel ideal for use on open fires, multi-fuel stoves and sold-fuel ranges and cookers.
